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




PREP INSTRUCTIONS:


Measure and cut lacing into 12" lengths.

PROJECT INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Glue a cardboard circle without a hole to one end of the cardboard tube. Let dry.
- 2. Place the pebbles, macaroni or rice inside the tube. Glue a circle with a hole to the other end of the tube. Let dry.
- 3. Place the tube on your work surface so the circle with the hole is facing up. Apply a generous amount of glue to the tip of one end of the dowel. Apply glue around the edge of the hole in the circle. Push the glued end of the dowel into the whole. Carefully push the dowel all the way in until it touches the other circle. Let dry making sure the dowel stays straight (see Figure A).
- 4. Paint the tube and the dowel with an original design. Let dry.



- 5. Glue three feathers into the hole of a bead and glue the bead to the top of the rattle at the center of the circle without a hole (see Figure B).
- 6. Apply glue around the end of the dowel. Place the stems of two feathers on the glue. Wrap one end of the lacing three times around the dowel and feather stems. Let dry. See Figure C.



7. Slide two beads onto the lacing. Glue the end bead to the end of the lacing. Glue the stem ends of two feathers into the bead. Let dry (see Figure C).
