Step # 1

Separate all the printed pieces from the cardboard sheets. There will be printed pieces for a department store, pizza shop, toy stores and several others. There is also a large piece of printed cardboard for the base of your shopping mall.

Step # 2

Use the supplied crayons to decorate all the buildings and the street. You can use your own markers or colored pencils for decoration. Use your creativity!

Step # 3

After decorating all the pieces you are ready to assemble your shopping mall.

- Fold the "building boxes" and set up as the building should look. The "roof" of the building is used to hold the building in the proper shape.
- You can also glue the roof for a permanent building.
- Place the buildings in any location that you feel looks great!
