

Clean work surface Small stones or shells Empty Tuna can Bird seed Containers for water Black Marker **PROJECT TIME: 45 min**






Project Instructions:

This kit is designed to utilize your recycled flat can, and stones or shells from nature.

- 1. Sand the sides and posts.
- 2. Wipe off excess sanding dust from the wood.
- 3. Push the posts onto opposite sides of the can.
- 4. Paint the roof. Allow to dry.
- 5. You may add marker lines to make the roof look like roof tiles.
- 6. Paint the posts. Set the roof onto the posts while paint is wet, so that the roof adheres to the wood posts.
- 7. Put the clay in a thin layer around the outside of the can. Set the stones or shells into the clay before it dries.
- 8. Sprinkle sand or dirt onto the clay to make it look more natural or paint the clay a natural color, by mixing the colors of paint. (white with a drop of orange and a drop of black make a terra cotta color which is nice.)

Note: The paint may also be thinned with water in order to look more natural. Allow to dry.
